Description: Provides electric service financial assistance applications for eligible low income AEP Ohio customers having difficulty paying their electric bill. Assistance is applied as a grant directly to client's electric bill to help maintain or restore basic electric service. \$200 maximum financial assistance per applicant per program year (December-April or July-Aug). **Eligibility:** AEP Ohio customers. Total gross household income must be at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines. Applicants must have paid at least \$75 on their AEP accounts in the 90 days prior to applying for the grant. **Intake:** Intake is done at the Salvation Army in The Plains. Call ahead to schedule an appointment at 740-797-1305. Must have proof of application/enrollment in HEAP program, proof of income, electric bill with account number, and Social Security cards and birth dates for everyone in household.

Eligibility: Homeowners 65 years and older or homeowners totally and permanently disabled. Must own and occupy the home or manufactured home as of January 1 in the calendar year of application. Veterans that have 100% service-connected disability or their surviving spouses may qualify for a larger property tax reduction.

Intake: Application must be filed with the county auditor between the first Monday in January and the first Monday in June for manufactured and mobile homes, and before December 31 for real property. Proof of age or disability must be provided. Call the auditor's office or visit the website for an application. Veterans with 100% service-connected disabilities or their surviving spouses must use separate application for larger reduction.
